# Dan Zimmermann –Blattner Field & Parks Board Updates

Consider Development Agreement for Blattner Field Improvements (spectator deck). This would be the same protocol as we used the for the grandstand. Parks Forever will be responsible for contracts and the end product and will donate the improvements to the city upon successful completion.

Motion Goebel to authorize Development Agreement as written for the spectator deck improvements Second Grutsch Passed Unanimously

Joann Dirkes was present from the Women of Today to share a bit about a project they are working on in hopes that eventually the trees along the Wobegon Trail could be lit for the holidays. To do this, there is a significant amount of electrical work that would be needed. This would also provide additional electric service for vendors for Spunk Days. In addition, the Women of Today would like to improve the nativity scene and build a stable around it. The Women of Today are also looking to update the sign at Wobegon Park. A total of around \$22,000 will be needed to complete all phases of this project. The electrical improvements could possibly be made this fall.

Motion Reiling to authorize the Women of Today, Parks Forever, and the Avon Lion's Club to work with city staff to make the electrical improvements as presented Second Schulzetenberge

Motion Reiling to accept a donation from Parks Forever for \$2,500 for concrete installation around the grandstand at Blattner Field Second Goebel Passed Unanimously

Zimmermann indicated that they are still working on fundraising for the dugout improvements at the youth field at Lion's Park.

# Jeremy Mathiasen, Stantec - Engineering Update

Mathiasen gave an update on various elements of the street and stormwater project currently in progress. Concrete finishing up tomorrow and Wednesday. Paving is scheduled for Friday and Monday. Project Update No. 5 was made available.

# **Administration**

Consider Resolution 2025-38 Joint Resolution as to Orderly Annexation

Leroy Gondringer and Chad Klocker were present to represent Avon Township. Gondringer listed a number of the farms that are in close proximity to Avon Estates and gave the council some assurance that none of the properties currently

located within 500' of Avon Estates are operating registered feedlots at this time. The 500' provision of the Orderly Annexation Agreement (Page 7 Section H.2.) should not be of concern in terms of the further development of Avon Estates.

Motion Schulzetenberge to approve Resolution 2025-38 Joint Resolution as to Orderly Annexation Area by and between the City of Avon and the Town of Avon Second Grutsch
Passed

Council discussed and considered Water Sewer Rate / SAC WAC Comparisons and Adjustments
At the budget and finance workshop, Financial Advisor Jason Murray of David Drown Associates had advised the council to continue annual modest increases to water and sewer rates throughout the life of the wastewater bonds. There is also a need for some water tower improvements in the very near future that will require additional funding.

Motion Schulzetenberge to increase Water Rates by 3% and Sewer Rates by 5% effective beginning with the mid-November reading for the 1<sup>st</sup> billing of 2026 (February billing) and to increase SAC to \$4200 and WAC \$1100 effective January 2026 Second Manthe Passed Unanimously

#### Sewer Main Break

Council was updated on the sewer main break. The city received the report from the Duty Officer which is a narrative of what was originally reported to the Duty Officer by Josh Blommer in our sewer department. The Duty Officer report is *not* an enforcement action letter. The report was duly sent to the MN Pollution Control Agency for review and subsequent enforcement action. Blommer, Kurtz and Austing-Traut have all spoken with representatives from the MPCA on separate occasions and have been assured that the required mitigation has been completed to the satisfaction of the MN Pollution Control Agency which is the regulatory and enforcement agency for this situation. Taylor Olson, one of those representatives, did provide some options for the council to consider for further mitigation if the council were interested in pursuing those, however, there is no requirement to do so.

# **Public Works**

Kurtz and Pelkey presented their written report. Hydrant flushing will occur likely the week of the 20<sup>th</sup>. Tomorrow Preferred Controls will be installing the headworks PLC. Radios on lift stations are installed and working correctly.

# **Police Department**

Chief Nellis presented his written report and stated that the encrypted radios have been ordered, the purchase was approved in the consent agenda. Donations were received to cover nearly all the cost.

# **Fire Department**

Request for approval for three new hires - Start date 11/1 contingent upon medical exams:

Grace Eivnck; Blake Maile; Matt Pantze

Another candidate had been recommended for hire, but withdrew his application due to family commitments.

Motion Grutsch to approve the three new hires contingent upon medical exams Second Goebel Passed Unanimously
